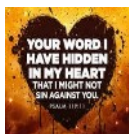

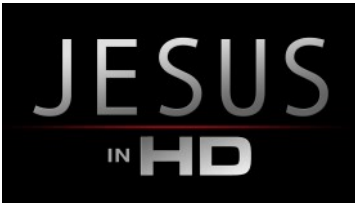

“When Jesus talked about bread, He was not presenting a new message. Every Jew was aware of the ‘daily bread’ given to their ancestors as they wandered for forty years looking for the Promised Land. God provided for the Israelites and Jesus offered a similar opportunity. He used the familiarity of bread to teach those with Him not to focus on the things that will spoil but the eternal blessings that He alone can provide. As the crowd sought Jesus, He realized that their desire was not for Him but for physical bread. They wanted their immediate needs fulfilled and weren’t focused on the eternal value they would receive through Him. Just like the crowd that followed Jesus, we have to stop and check our desires. Do we want Jesus or the things He can provide? Are we more concerned with immediate satisfaction or are we looking ahead to true satisfaction in Him? Are we concerned with immediate blessings or eternal blessings? I find it interesting that the One who called Himself ‘The Bread of Life’ was born in the town of Bethlehem which means ‘house of bread.’” *cupofjoy.org*
